The following spiritual gifts* are represented in this catalog. Most of the ministries included in the catalog offer at least one of these gifts useful in participating in the work of that ministry. Please use this list, and each gift's brief description, to learn more about your spiritual gifts.

ADMINISTRATION

Understands what makes an organization function, and the special ability to plan and execute procedures that accomplish the goals of the ministry. Contributes: Efficiency.

CRAFTSMANSHIP

Creatively designs and/or constructs items to be used for ministry. Contributes: Skills.

CREATIVE COMMUNICATION

Communicates God's truth through a variety of art forms. Contributes: Artistic Expression.

DISCERNMENT

Distinguishes between truth and error. Discern the Spirit's differentiating between good and evil, right and wrong. Contributes: Clarity.

ENCOURAGEMENT

Presents truth so as to strengthen, comfort or urge to action those who are discouraged or wavering in their faith. Contributes: Affirmation.

EVANGELISM

Effectively communicates the gospel to unbelievers so they respond in faith and move toward discipleship. Contributes: The Good News.

FAITH

Acts on God's promises with confidence and unwavering belief in God's ability to fulfill his purposes. Contributes: Confidence.

GIVING

Contributes money and resources to the work of the Lord with cheerfulness and liberality. Contributes: Resources.

HELPS

Attaches spiritual value to the accomplishment of practical and necessary tasks that free up, support and meet the needs of others. Contributes: Support.

HOSPITALITY

Cares for people by providing fellowship, food and shelter. Contributes: Acceptance.

INTERCESSION

Consistently prays on behalf of and for others, seeing frequent and specific results. Contributes: Protection.

KNOWLEDGE

Brings truth to the Body through a revelation or biblical insight. Contributes: Awareness.

LEADERSHIP

Casts vision to motivate and influence people to harmoniously accomplish the purposes of God. Contributes: Direction.

MERCY

Cheerfully and practically helps those who are suffering or are in need, having compassion that is moved to action. Contributes: Care.

SHEPHERDING

Nurtures, cares for, and guides people toward ongoing spiritual maturity and becoming like Christ, Contributes: Nurture.

TEACHING

Understands, clearly explains and applies the Word of God, causing greater Christlikeness in the lives of listeners. Contributes: Application.

WISDOM

Effectively applies spiritual truth to meet a need in a specific situation. Contributes: Guidance.

Description

In Kingdom Kids, we are **bold** about sharing the gospel so that our elementary-age children are encouraged and reminded of who they are in Christ and equipped for their personal walk with Jesus! Our Sunday school teachers are prepared and trained, along with their own gifts and talents, to lovingly teach and build relationships with the children.

Needs

Sunday school teachers, assistants and substitutes work in teams. Teachers lead a classroom during the 10.10 am Sunday school hour. Lead teachers commit to teaching at least twice a month. Substitutes and helpers can work out a schedule that fits their needs with the Kingdom Kids Coordinator. FPC staff take care of classroom setup, materials and clean up.

Middle School Helper: Come and have fun with the kids once or twice a month on Sundays, 5–7 pm.




