Lebanon Medical Mission Trip

Thank you for all your prayers, love and support for my recent trip to Lebanon. I am still thinking through and processing all I saw, felt and learned from this first ever medical mission trip to displaced Syrian refugees.

The main thing that pops to mind, as memories fill my day, is the people. The people inspired me to work hard and be generous for the benefit of others which in turn benefited me, making me laugh and cry.

In general, the people of Lebanon and Syria are passionate and they love their country. We were complete strangers to them, yet they welcomed us. The primary focus of our trip was medical missions. Of the more than two million displaced refugees in Lebanon, we saw approximately 800 people in four days (two days in Beirut and two days in Tyre) in Christian churches where the two medical clinics were set up by missionaries and their pastors. While at the first clinic in Beirut, we saw the faces of about 450 children and mothers. In the second clinic, we saw about 350 children and mothers; almost all were displaced Muslim refugees from Syria and Palestine.

Our missionaries, Nour and Rebecca Botros, set up the arrangements for food, housing, transportation and activities. They were incredible and poured their lives into the entire team while we were there.

I could not have imagined a better team: thirteen individuals from two presbyteries and seven churches. All hands were on deck from the moment we arrived in Beirut. After only a short nap, the pharmacy had to be prepared with our six doctors. This preparation took twelve hours with each member of the team



giving selflessly. We had moments of sickness and extreme fatigue, yet each team member picked up the other. I grew to love each person.

Coming home is always a challenge. It's hard to slip back into the busy life that seems so mundane. How do I keep what I have experienced and pass it on to you? How do I maintain the feeling of making a real difference in beautiful lives around our planet? How do we make this world a smaller more intimate place where we touch and affect others in places like Lebanon and Syria? It is easy to be paralyzed by so much trouble in the world and not enough time or resources....but we can do something. Dream BIG!

Again, thank you for your contributions of prayer, love and finances. With those, you have made the world a better place and I challenge each of you to do it again. Sponsor someone on the next trip to Lebanon, support our missionaries, be purposeful in prayer, or go on a trip with me to the Middle East next year. And don't stop there! Tutor a child at our partner schools. Buchanan Elementary and Gardere Community Christian School; develop a relationship with LSU international students and invite them into your home for a meal; mentor a struggling teen; or come with me to the local mosque and have lunch with the Imam, Emad (my treat). You know what stirs your heart. Chase it. Get out there, the world needs you. The CROSS of Jesus Christ has made you flawless!
