Lent: Windows and Wounds

On February 8th we will begin distributing copies of *Rich Wounds: The Countless Treasures of the Life, Death and Triumph of Jesus*. This book by our friend David Mathis, contains 30 pithy reflections on the person and work of Christ. Reviews affirm this study is "sweet balm for your heart," and "beautiful and deeply edifying." David is executive editor for *desiringgod.org* and preached for us in 2024.

On Sundays, I'll be preaching a series called *Windows on the Cross*. We will look at six Biblical perspectives on the meaning of Christ's death. From "peace" to "justice" to "atonement" to "victory," we'll take a sounding of the deep truths of resurrected life that arise from Jesus' crucifixion. It should be a rich season!

IS THIS THE YEAR? JOIN A COMMUNITY GROUP

Lent is almost here and at First Presbyterian Church, that means it's time to gather, grow, and go a little deeper together. Beginning the week of February 18, our Lent Community Groups will kick off across the church, inviting everyone into a season of meaningful connection and thoughtful reflection. Whether you're already plugged into a group or have been thinking, "This might be my year," Lent is the perfect time to jump in.

All Community Groups will be journeying together through *Rich Wounds: The Countless Treasures of the Life, Death, and Triumph of Jesus*, a 30-day devotional by David Mathis. This study invites us to slow down, sit with the story of Jesus, meditate on his sacrificial love, and appreciate the significance of his wounds. Copies of the book will be provided to the entire congregation on Sunday, February 8 so that everyone can start the journey together.

Several groups handle childcare in creative and easy ways, and there is even an option with free childcare for groups that meet at the church on Sunday nights. 1827: REV. DORRANCE, CHASE, AND CHAMBERLAIN TEAM TOGETHER

In 1827, Rev. John Dorrance, a Presbyterian missionary sent by the Mississippi Presbytery, helped shape the early Christian community in Baton Rouge. Soon after his arrival, he began regular preaching and encouraged organized religious instruction.

By April 1827, a Sunday school had been established, and worship services were first held in the parish courthouse, then in a small-framed building. On May 13, 1827, a local tract society was organized to distribute religious literature in cooperation with the American Tract Society, a national Protestant organization founded to publish and circulate Christian tracts for evangelism and moral education.

As interest continued to grow, plans were made to organize a church. Dorrance was assisted by Rev. Benjamin Chase and Rev. Jeremiah Chamberlain of Jackson, Mississippi. Dorrance's leadership helped establish enduring patterns of worship, education, and outreach in Baton Rouge's early years.
